ORDINANCE NO. 05 Series of 2020

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING ANY PERSON FROM COMMITTING ANY DISGRACES, SHAMES, HUMILIATES, WHICH OR OTHERWISE NEGATIVELY STIGMATIZES **DISCRIMINATES** COVID-19, WITH THOSE UNDER MONITORING INVESTIGATION THEREFOR, HEALTH **WORKERS** AND FRONTLINERS, AND IMPOSING THE APPROPRIATE PENALTIES THEREFOR.

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, President Rodrigo Duterte issued Proclamation No. 922, declaring a State of Public Health Emergency Calamity throughout the Philippines due to the Corona Virus Disease 2019 (COVID-19); also the Code Alert System for COVID-19 was raised to Code Red Sub

Level Two (2) in accordance with the recommendation of the Department of Health (DOH) and the Inter-Agency Task Force (IATF) for Emerging Infectious Diseases; and still further, Presidential Proclamation No. 929, series of 2020 was issued declaring a State of Calamity throughout the Philippines due to COVID-19;

WHEREAS, as of May 5, 2020, there have been 7,639 confirmed cases of the COVID-19 in the Philippines, with thousands of Persons Under Investigation (PUIs) or "Suspect" and Persons Under Monitoring (PUMs) or "Probable";

WHEREAS, in Bataan, as of even date, there are one hundred seven (107) confirmed cases, eighty-one (81) of which are Health Workers;

WHEREAS, since the emergence of COVID-19 we have seen instances of public stigmatization against persons who have contracted the disease including PUIs and PUMs, and the rise of harmful stereotypes, with people being labelled, stereotyped, separated and/or experience loss of status and discrimination because of a potential negative affiliation with the disease;

WHEREAS, stigmatization could drive people to hide the illness to avoid discrimination or prevent people from seeking health care immediately and discourage them from adopting healthy behaviors;

WHEREAS, the Department of Health (DOH) recently warned the public against discrimination against persons reported to have contracted COVID-19 as well as PUIs, PUMs including Health Workers and Frontliners who are among those directly involved in the battle against the rapidly spreading COVID-19; the DOH stated "that with the world confronted with a virus with little information known it is human to be afraid, (b)ut we must not follow hysteria and paranoia to result in irrational treatment of people";

WHEREAS, there have been several reported incidents of people being evicted out of their residences or after having recovered from the illness were prevented from returning back to their residences, while some were even doused with water and were refused services in eateries or transportations over fears of infection; some were shunned by local stores, boarding houses, and even their own barangays and homes;

WHEREAS, several untruthful and inaccurate social media posts even dirculated online spreading names and circumstances of people alleged to have been infected with COVID-19, thus causing not only disdain for the named person, but likewise panic and unnecessary worries among those falsely informed;

WHEREAS, considering the gravity of the situation, there is an urgent need to combat this pervasive stigmatization on the basis of one's medical condition or status; to bring normalcy and order amidst the crisis, and protect its constituency from unjust discrimination brought by fear and panic by public;

WHEREAS, it is in these trying times that the Provincial Government of Bataan invokes the principle of *parens patriae* by making sure that all shall show compassion, empathy and tolerance towards its affected constituents;

WHEREAS, as this virus can inflict any person regardless of race, age, sex or social standing, thus only though a united front, strengthened by our religious conviction, can we fight and end this pandemic;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 11, Article II of the 1987 Constitution embodying the state's policy in embracing the value of human dignity and in guaranteeing full respect for human rights, the Provincial Government of Bataan (PGB) reaffirms its faith in fundamental human rights, in the dignity and worth of the human person, that all human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights, without distinction;

WHEREAS, Article 19 and 20 of the New Civil Code provides that every person must act with justice, give everyone his due and observe honesty and good faith and every person who, contrary to law, wilfully or negligently causes damage to another, shall be liable to indemnify the other;

WHEREAS, Article 26 of the New Civil Code requires every person to respect the dignity, personality, privacy and peace of every person and that vexing or humiliating another on account of his physical defect or other personal condition, which is COVID-19-related for that matter, shall warrant the filing of an appropriate action in court for damages, prevention and other reliefs;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Civil Code, every person must honour and respect his contractual obligations such as contracts of lease or employment, especially in this challenging times, whether such person is infected with the COVID-19, PUI, PUM, health care worker, emergency worker and or other front-line worker;

WHEREAS, the General Welfare clause of the Local Government Code of 1991, provides that "(e)very **local government** unit shall exercise the powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefrom, as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective **governance**, and those which are essential to the promotion of the **general welfare**";

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan of Bataan, in session assembled, THAT:

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE. – This Ordinance shall be known as "Anti Covid-19 Discrimination Ordinance of 2020".

SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS. – The following terms shall be defined, for purposes of this Ordinance, as follows:

Infected Persons, Patients Under Investigation (PUIs) (Probable) and Persons Under Monitoring (PUMs) (Suspect) shall have the same definition as provided in the relevant protocols and guidelines issued and as may be issued by the Department of Health.

Health workers are those who deliver care and services to the sick and ailing, directly or indirectly, whether in public or private medical establishments. Health workers include, among others, doctors, nurses, hospital and clinic aides, and laboratory technicians.

Frontliners include officers and members of the Philippine National Police (PNP), Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP), Philippine Coast Guard (PCG) and other instrumentalities of the government rendering emergency services, border control and other critical services. Frontliners also include service workers who are engaged in private establishments providing basic necessities and such activities related to food and medicine production, i.e. public markets, supermarkets, groceries, convenience stores, pharmacies and drug stores, food preparation and delivery services, water refiling stations, manufacturing and processing plants of basic food products and medicines, banks, money transfer services, power, telecommunications and water supplies and other related facilities.

SECTION 3. UNLAWFUL ACTS. – The following are punishable under this Act:

- 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, to commit any act or make any utterance which slanders, disgraces, shames, humiliates, harasses, discriminates or otherwise negatively stigmatizes an Infected Person, PUIs, PUMs, Health Worker or Frontliner;
- It shall be unlawful for any public employee or official to unreasonably deny access to public or social programs and services otherwise available to the public and subject to qualifications; or refuse or fail to render assistance as part of the performance of his functions, to any Infected Person, PUIs, PUMs, Health Worker or Frontliner;
- 3. It shall be prohibited for any person to impede or prevent the return of a person who recovered from Covid-19, PUIs, PUMs, Health Worker or Frontliner to his/her place of residence or domicile, despite his/her possession of a sufficient clearance from Covid-19 as issued by the proper health official or entity. Eviction therefrom under the same circumstances shall likewise be prohibited;
- 4. It shall be unlawful for any person to refuse entry, utilization or expel any Health Worker or Frontliner from public markets, supermarkets, groceries, bakeshops, convenience stores, hotels, motels, public transportation and other similar establishments by reason of their profession or exposure to medical risks.
- 5. It shall be unlawful, for any person to publicly claim, post on social media, spread or announce that a specific person is infected with Covid-19, under investigation or monitoring due to Covid-19, whether or not true, confirmed or validated. This violation covers the address, information on family members and other relevant information that may incite contempt, harassment,

discrimination or humiliation to the specific person or his/her family. There shall be no violation under this paragraph for purposes of contact tracing and other medical purposes where the use of such information is necessary, or when the person waives his/her right to privacy.

SECTION 4. PENALTIES. – Any person in violation of Section 3 hereof shall be fined with Five Thousand Pesos (₱5,000.00) or imprisonment not exceeding one year (1) or both fine and imprisonment, at the discretion of the court.

If the person violating is a public officer, the penalty imposed shall be in its maximum, without prejudice to filing of an administrative case against said official.

If committed by a juridical entity, the President, General Manager, Corporate Secretary or person with related interest in the Corporation or Partnership shall be held liable or penalized accordingly. In addition, if the violation is directly in connection with its business operations, the additional penalty of revocation or suspension of business permit of the business establishment may likewise be imposed.

The penalties provided herein are without prejudice to the filing of any other criminal, civil or administrative cases against the violator.

SECTION 5. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. – If for any reason or reasons, any part or provision of this Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid, other parts or provisions hereof, which are not affected thereby, shall continue to be in full force and effect.

SECTION 6. REPEALING CLAUSE. – All ordinances, rules or regulations in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed; provided, that the rights already vested under those Ordinances, rules or regulations shall not be impaires.

SECTION 7. EFFECTIVITY CLAUSE. – This Ordinance shall take effect upon compliance with the relevant requirements.
