I. EXTENSION SERVICES

Outcome: Enhance productivity of Bataeños; Achieve stable and self-sufficient families

Goal: Human Development Index, Quality Growth

WHIRLWIND:

JULY – DECEMBER

1. Technology Transfer

- ✓ 89% (17/19) farmer graduates monitored with 71% adopting the cassava production technology

2. Technology Demonstration for Farmers

- ✓ 100% of scheduled activities completed at an average of 5 working days before the deadline

3. Season-Long Training For Farmers

- ✓ 100% of farmer participants completed the Climate Resilient Farm Business School - Farmer's Field School (CRFBS-FFS) with 100% satisfactory rating

High Quality Inbred Rice Seed Production

JANUARY - JUNE

- ✓ 40 out of 40 (100%) bags of high quality inbred rice seeds produced in the production area of OPA were utilized as they were distributed to all farmer seed producers selected from the targetted barangays in Bagac, namely Saysain, Paysawan, Binuangan and Quinawan

JULY – DECEMBER

Community Seed Banking

- ✓ 17% increased yield performance of adoptors achieved

II. INSTITUTIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Outcome: Enhance productivity of Bataeños; Achieve stable and self-sufficient families

WHIRLWIND:

1. Production Support to Farmer Groups & Rural Based Organization

JANUARY - JUNE

- ✓ 100% (5,000 out of 5,000) cacao seedlings were distributed. The grafted seedlings are specifically 2,500 pieces of BR25 and 2,500 pieces of UF18 varieties. All of these were assessed to be in good

condition considering the handling and transportation of the seedlings resulting to 100% seedlings planted.

JULY – DECEMBER

- ✓ 92% (4,600 out of the 5,000) of the cacao seedlings planted were monitored with an 87% (4,000 out of 4,600) survival rate

2. Livelihood Assistance to Farmer Groups & Rural Based Organization

JANUARY - JUNE

- ✓ Seven (7) machineries provided to five (5) farmer associations from December 2020 to 2021 were monitored relative to the utilization and income generation through the intervention:
 - Greater Bani Multi-purpose Cooperative (MPC) – Balanga City, received a combine harvester with a baseline net loss of Php 32,802.16 (due to intensive repairs of the old combine harvester) generated an income of Php 61,303.38 (386%);
 - Laon Farmers Association (FA) – Abucay, received a mini 4-Wheel Drive (4WD) tractor and increased its income from Php 2,008.17 to Php 15,808.00 (787.18%);
 - Pentor FA – Dinalupihan, received a 4WD tractor with an increased income from Php 20,846.00 to Php 86,966.00 (483.17%);
 - Sapa SRI FA – Samal, received a 4WD tractor with increased income from Php 4,600.00 to Php 22,226.00 (483.17%); and
 - Saysain PalayCheck FA, Inc. – Bagac, received a hand tractor, mini 4WD tractor and rice reaper with increased incomes from the baseline Php 61,528.00 to Php 75,348.00 (22.46%), Php 110,044.00 (78.85%) and Php 124,546.00 (102.42%), respectively.
- ✓ Two (2) cooperatives that received Livelihood Enhancement for Agricultural Development – Roll Over Fund (LEAD-ROF) financial assistance in 2021 and 2022 were also monitored:
 - Capitangan Organic Farmers Marketing Cooperative – Abucay, increase its income from Php 271.00 to Php 1,600.00 (490%);
 - Community Savers Agricultural Cooperative – Bagac, increased its income from Php 5,313.00 to Php 7,147.00 (34.50%);
 - Farmers Choice Association – Dinalupihan, received a LEAD-ROF financial assistance but will be monitored after a cycle of production/business operation; and
 - One (1) association, particularly the combine harvester of Sitio Tiis FA – Bagac was subjected to 2nd monitoring of the intervention. The baseline value is Php 24,225.00 which is changed to Php 33,120.00 for a sustained income of 136.72%.

JULY – DECEMBER

- ✓ Three (3) machineries and one (1) LEAD-ROF financial assistance provided to farmer associations were monitored:
 - Dela Rosa Irrigators Association – Abucay, received a 4WD tractor with a baseline income of Php 7,200.00 increased to Php 57,709.00 (701.59%);
 - Mabuco Farmers Association – Hermosa, received a 4WD tractor generated an increase in income from Php 752.00 to Php 3,565.00 (374.07%);
 - Farmers Choice Association – Dinalupihan, received a LEAD-ROF financial assistance had an increase in income from Php1,800.00 to Php 7,595.00 (321.94%);
 - Samahan ng mga Magsasaka ng Barangay Sapang Balas (SMBSB) – Dinalupihan, received a combine harvester and had a sustained income of 115.45% from the first monitoring; 2nd monitoring amounting to Php 85,943.00 and Php 99,225.00,

respectively; and

- All farmer association beneficiaries had a 100% satisfactory rating during the monitoring.

3. Livelihood Trainings to Farmer Groups and Rural Based Organization

- ✓ 250% (5/2) of the scheduled trainings were conducted with 100% satisfactory rating. 100% (114/114) of the participants completed their respective trainings. Trainings conducted are:
 - Livelihood Training on Fish Processing: Milkfish Deboning, Smoking, and Fish Bottling (August 19);
 - Two-Day Livelihood Training on Fish and Meat Processing (October 13-14);
 - Livelihood Training/Demonstration on Food Processing (October 25);
 - Livelihood Training on Fish Processing: Milkfish Deboning, Fish Smoking, and Fish Bottling (November 4); and
 - 4H Club MNHS Camaya Campus Orientation and Organic Fertilizer Training (December 6)

III. RESEARCH

JANUARY – JUNE

- ✓ 100% (6/6) of activities (sowing of seeds, pulling of seedlings, lay-outing, transplanting of seedlings, installation of placards and harvesting) for dry & wet season for Next Gen Project for both municipalities of Abucay and Dinalupihan were completed before the specified target date of completion

JULY – DECEMBER

- ✓ 100% of harvest data and scheduled activities completed at an average of 12 working days before the deadline. Activities for the Next-Gen Plus Project:
 - Increasing Access to Adoptive Rice Varieties in the Philippines in Abucay was completed at an average of 15 working days before the deadline; and
 - Validation of Different Fertilizer Recommendations and Nitrogen Calibration on the Growth and Yield Performance of Rice in Region 3 had an average of 7 working days before the deadline.

- ✓ 36 out of 47 (77%) employees attended related trainings with training reports submitted at an average of 2 days after the training
 - 28 regular employees out of 37 (72%)

- 8 job order (JO) employees out of 8 (100%)

JULY – DECEMBER

- ✓ 47 out of 47 (100%) employees attended related trainings. All trainings were related to the particular attendees.
 - 38 regular employees out of 38 (100%)
 - 9 JO employees out of 9 (100%)

- ✓ 100% of the reports were submitted at an average of 4.73 days before the deadline which include inventory reports (corn, high value crops (HVC), fishery, soils and rice); monthly reports (HVC, corn, fishery, Integrated Pest Management (IPM)); weekly reports on rice, price monitoring, CAFOA expenditures, L&D tracking, Quarterly Report on Government PPAs, DPCR and IPCR Accomplishments and Targets, Annual Procurement Plan (APP), Annual Investment Program (AIP), Whole of Government (WOG) Reengineering Manual, Citizens Charter and other reports:
 - Eight (8) reports were submitted 1-3 days before the deadline: DPCR 2021 - 2nd Semester, Accomplishments, Rice Inventory Report (March, April, and June); Corn Inventory Report (April); HVC Inventory Report (April); Soils Inventory Report (April); L&D Tracking (April); and
 - One (1) report was submitted within the deadline: IPCR 2021 - 2nd Semester Accomplishments

JULY – DECEMBER

- ✓ 100% of the reports submitted at an average of 7 days before the deadline which include inventory reports (corn, HVC, fishery, soils and rice), monthly reports (HVC, corn, fishery, IPM), weekly reports on rice, price monitoring, CAFOA expenditures, L&D tracking, Quarterly Report on Government PPAs, DPCR and IPCR Accomplishments and Targets, Citizen’s Charter, and other reports:
 - Nineteen (19) reports were submitted 1-3 days before the deadline (rice inventory and weekly report, L&D tracking-July, DPCR and IPCR Accomplishment and Target, PMC, PDP, Annual Budget, corn inventory-August/November, soils inventory-September/December, HVC inventory-December);
 - Two (2) reports were submitted within the deadline (SI proposals and rice weekly report-1st week of December); and
 - Other reports were submitted more than 3 days before the deadline.

2. Provision of Intervention Support

JANUARY – JUNE






- ✓ 100% (154 out of 154) of the requests for intervention support had satisfactory rating;
- ✓ 82 out of 82 requests classified as simple were addressed in less than 1 hour;
 - 54 requests for assorted high quality vegetable seeds seeds (kangkong, kamatis, pechay, sitaw, kalabasa, okra, lettuce, sili); 27 for tilapia fingerlings; and 1 delivery for intervention under OAP
- ✓ 69 out of 72 requests classified as highly technical were addressed within the day; 2 out of 72 were addressed after 1 day; and 1 out of 72 was addressed in 2 days; and
 - 10 clients requested for molasses; 37 for NEB (soil ameliorant liquid root exudates/liquid fertilizer); and 25 asked for trichoderma
- ✓ A total of 102 bottles of molasses, 206 bottles of NEB and 2,643 packs of trichoderma were requested and issued to clients.








JULY – DECEMBER






- ✓ 100% (182 out of 182) requests for intervention support were provided with 100% satisfactory rating:
 - 148 out of 148 requests classified as simple were addressed at an average of 38 minutes (82 requests for seeds; 59 for fingerlings; 4 for soil ameliorant; and 3 seeds with fertilizers); and
 - 34 out of 34 requests classified as highly technical were addressed within the day (17 asked for trichoderma; 16 clients requested for molasses; and 1 for organic farming supplies).
