WHEREAS, under Section 16 of Republic Act (RA) No. 7160, or the "Local Government Code of 1991," it is the responsibility of local government units to "xxx promote the health and safety, enhance the right of the people to a balanced ecology, encourage and support the development of appropriate and self-reliant scientific and technological capabilities, improve public morals, enhance economic prosperity and social justice, promote full employment

WHEREAS, pursuant to the foregoing mandate, the Provincial Government of Bataan (PGB) implements various assistance programs intended to alleviate the plight, especially of the marginalized residents and promote their welfare, comfort and convenience;

WHEREAS, in implementing the assistance programs, the PGB heavily relies on the list of beneficiaries identified by the component city and municipalities based on records that are likely incomplete and/or not updated;

WHEREAS, to effectively carry out the existing assistance programs and introduce other appropriate poverty alleviation interventions, it is indispensable that the basis for planning, formulating policies, establishing programs and identifying beneficiaries are targeted, aligned and responsive to their needs;

WHEREAS, to inculcate a sense of responsibility, strengthen the commitment of the beneficiaries to the program objectives and promote their success, it is equally important to attach the eligibility and entitlement to the completion of certain other requirements;

WHEREAS, R.A. No. 11315, otherwise known as the "Community-Based Monitoring System Act" established and instituted a Community-Based Monitoring System (CBMS) in every city and municipality as an economic and social tool for the formulation and implementation of poverty alleviation and development programs which are specific, targeted and responsive to the basic needs of each sector of the community;

WHEREAS, the CBMS is an organized technology-based system of collecting, processing and validating necessary disaggregated data that may be used for planning, program implementation and impact monitoring at the local level while empowering communities to participate in the process;

WHEREAS, the CBMS involves the generation of data at the local level which serves as basis in targeting households in planning, budgeting and implementing programs geared towards poverty alleviation and economic development;

WHEREAS, R.A. No. 11315 mandates the conduct of regular and synchronized data collection every three (3) years. It further enjoins all cities and municipalities to collect data at shorter intervals for purposes peculiarly useful to them and allows provinces to have access to their respective local and territory-specific data;

WHEREAS, the utilization of the disaggregated data generated by the component city and municipality through the CBMS provides assurance that the poverty alleviation programs of the province are extended to the individuals, households or sectors most in need;

WHEREAS, R.A. No. 11908, otherwise known as "The Parent Effectiveness Service Program Act", mandates the establishment and implementation of the Parent Effectiveness Service (PES) Program to strengthen parental involvement in their children's development and learning;

WHEREAS, the PES Program is required to be implemented by cities and municipalities through their respective social welfare and development offices. Private organizations accredited by the Department of Social Welfare and Development may also implement the PES Program in coordination with the LGU concerned;

WHEREAS, to ensure the meaningful, coherent, targeted, and responsive implementation of the programs, it is necessary to incorporate the completion of the CBMS and PES Program among the conditions for the eligibility and entitlement to the benefits extended by specific poverty alleviation programs of the PGB;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE SANGGUNIANG PANLALAWIGAN IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SEC. 1. Title. - This Ordinance shall be named and cited as the "Matatag na Pamilyang Bataeño Ordinance of 2022."

SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy. - It is the policy of the Provincial Government of Bataan to provide efficient and effective governance geared towards the promotion of the general welfare of its inhabitants. Towards these end, the PGB shall implement poverty alleviation programs that are specific, targeted, and responsive to the needs of its constituents.

SEC. 3. Poverty Alleviation Programs. - The PGB shall implement and make available poverty alleviation programs and benefits including, but not limited, to the following:

Provincial Social Welfare and Development Office (PSWDO)	Financial Assistance on Medical, Hospital, Burial, and Emergency Shelter	This program caters to clients in need of financial assistance for medical expenses, burial costs, and emergency shelter.
	Rice Subsidy Program	Subsidy of rice to vulnerable sectors particularly those in the service provider community.
	Provision of Mobility Devices	The program aims to assist persons with disabilities (PWDs) through the provision of mobility devices such as wheelchairs.
	Processed Billing Statements of Funeral Service Providers Under Libreng Libing Program (LLP)	For indigent constituents who do not have the means to afford a decent funeral service for their deceased family member, LLP is extended to all qualified indigents.
	EDUCHILD	The program consists of ten module course designed to instill

The implementing departments, however, taking into consideration the nature of the programs and the intended beneficiaries, may provide an exemption therefrom in the specific eligibility and documentary requirements that they may respectively promulgate for each of the programs, subject to the approval of the Provincial Governor.

For the constituents who fail to comply with the requirements, particularly the preventive health check-ups along with the completion of CBMS and PES Program, but nonetheless applied for program coverage, they shall be eligible for assistance on the condition that they execute an affidavit of undertaking stating that they will comply with all the requirements to be eligible for future assistance and coverage under any of the programs of the PGB.

For programs fully or partially funded by the National Government or by non-government organizations, the PGB may integrate the eligibility requirements set through this Ordinance insofar as it may be authorized to screen, assess, and select the intended beneficiaries.

SEC. 5. Appropriation. - The amount necessary for the implementation of this Ordinance shall be included in the appropriation ordinance of the province starting fiscal year 2023. The concerned city and municipality must also provide adequate funding for the PES Program's implementation.

SEC. 6. Provincial Personal Data Card. - Upon enactment of a separate ordinance therefor, registration with the Provincial Personal Data Card system shall be included in the eligibility requirements for the poverty alleviation programs and benefits provided by the PGB.

SEC. 7. Transitory Provision. - The programs and benefits provided for in this Ordinance shall become effective and commence implementation beginning January 1, 2023. Pending effectivity, all existing assistance programs of the PGB shall continue to be implemented pursuant to existing ordinances and relevant issuances governing them.

SEC. 8. Separability Clause. - If, for any reason, any part or provision of this Ordinance is declared invalid or unconstitutional, the remaining parts or provisions not affected shall remain in full force and effect.

SEC. 9. Repealing Clause. - Subject to the herein above Transitory Provision, all ordinances, resolutions, local executive orders or administrative regulations which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SEC. 10. Effectivity. - This Ordinance shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in a local newspaper of general circulation.




